



Eligibility

All abstracts must be submitted electronically.

Meeting Registration - An author (the presenter) is required to register and participate in the annual meeting.

Prior Publication and Presentation - The data in the submitted abstract must not have been published or presented at any other national or international annual scientific meeting.

Number of Abstracts - Authors can submit an unlimited number of abstracts.

Number of Authors - There is no limit on the number of authors on an abstract.

Membership - Authors **do not** have to be ATA members or have a member sponsor to submit an abstract. However, ATA members do save on registration rates. Join today –

Meeting Registration



An author of the abstract is required to register and present in person at the Annual Meeting. Registration for the 2026 Annual Meeting will open by the Summer.

Format

- All abstracts must be submitted electronically.
- Titles should be brief, describe the content of the abstract, and be in title case (ex. This is an Example of Title Case).
- Titles should not exceed 50 words and should not contain author names or affiliations.
- The abstract body should not exceed 350 words.
- Author(s) are strongly encouraged to save an electronic or printed copy of their abstract for their records before submitting.
- Tables, graphs, and images are not permitted in the abstract submission but are encouraged to be included in the oral or poster presentations.



Format

- Scientific Abstracts should include:
 - ✓ Objective
 - ✓ Methods
 - ✓ Results
 - ✓ Discussion/Conclusion
- Case Studies* should include:
 - ✓ Introduction
 - ✓ Description of the Case
 - ✓ Discussion



Submission Fee

The abstract submission fee is required, is a **nonrefundable** processing fee, and not based on approval of your abstract submission.

- Regular Call - \$69.00 USD
- Late Breaking - \$99.00 USD

Presentation Types

All accepted abstracts must be presented in person. Authors may indicate preferred presentation format(s), but preferences do not guarantee assignment. The Program Committee determines the final presentation type.

- **Oral Presentation**

- In-person presentation during an Oral Abstract Session
- 8-minute talk + 4–5 minute Q&A
- Up to 40 top-scoring abstracts selected

- **Poster Presentation**

- In-person poster presentation during the Poster Review Session
- Optional 90-second video for the electronic poster gallery
- All other accepted abstracts will be assigned to Poster Presentation.

Abstract Submission Policy & Author Responsibilities

The American Thyroid Association (ATA) requests submission of abstracts for consideration at ATA scientific meetings to feature new data presented as posters or oral presentations. The ATA goal is to provide the audience and the media with new data that are unpublished (in print or electronic) which are being publicly presented for the first time. Authors are asked to strictly comply with this requirement; data that are to become available to the public in the setting of a national or international meeting before their presentation at the ATA meeting are not eligible for presentation at the ATA meeting. Data may be submitted for publication before or after abstract submission to the ATA. However, data accepted for publication prior to the ATA meeting would REQUIRE the authors to request the publisher to embargo their publication (electronic and print) until 8:00 am local time the first day of the ATA meeting or would REQUIRE the authors to withdraw their abstract from the ATA meeting. Many editors are favorable to embargo requests because of the attention that may be drawn to the publication after original presentation of the data at a major meeting. Further, the authors are welcome to announce the date and place of their anticipated publication if known. Authors that do not comply with this policy may be restricted from future abstract submissions for a term to be determined by the ATA Executive Committee. Arbitration, if needed, will occur via the ATA Board of Directors.

Publications

All accepted abstracts will be published electronically as a supplement to the *Thyroid*[®] Journal in November 2026.

Media & Press Embargo

The media, companies and institutions issuing press releases, and others are required to abide by the embargo policies governing the ATA's annual meeting. The abstracts selected for presentation at the meeting will be published in a special online issue of *Thyroid*, by Mary Ann Liebert, Inc., publishers - <https://www.liebertpub.com/loi/thy> in September 2026. The information contained in the abstracts is embargoed until the abstracts are available online. Coverage of information that goes beyond the scope of the abstract (e.g., additional analysis, commentary, or updated information from those individuals and companies involved in the study) is embargoed according to the following criteria:

- **Oral** presentations: the embargo deadline is the start time of the session in which the presentation is being made.
- **Posters** presentations: the embargo lifts when the poster session in which the poster is presented opens for viewing in the morning (i.e., when the poster hall opens that day).

Publication Embargo

Data may be submitted for publication before or after abstract submission to the ATA. However, data accepted for publication prior to the ATA meeting would REQUIRE the authors to request the publisher to embargo their publication (electronic and print) until 8:00 am local time the first day of the ATA meeting or would REQUIRE the authors to withdraw their abstract from the ATA meeting. Many editors are favorable to embargo requests because of the attention that may be drawn to the publication after original presentation of the data at a major meeting.
